## SCHEDULE

### Proposed Rule change to Class 6 with effect from 20 February 2010

---

The proposed change is set out below with additional wording underlined.

#### **Rule 3 Nature of Cover**

**Amend** the Rule by including the following as a new Rule 3(5):

**Sanctions 3(5)**      Notwithstanding and without prejudice to any other provision of these Rules, including Rule 3(3), and the provisions of the Memorandum and Articles of Association, these Rules may, on such notice as the Committee may in its discretion decide, be amended at any time (including with effect during the course of a Policy Year) to such extent as the Committee may in its discretion determine is necessary as a result of the potential or actual implementation of or change in any sanction, prohibition, restriction, legislation, regulation or requirement to obtain any licence or approval, by any state, international organisation or other competent authority.

**EXPLANATION:** The imposition of sanctions or other prohibitions or legislative changes could occur during the course of a policy year and could require alterations in the Rules. The new Rule provides the Committee with the power to make such changes as it determines are necessary.
